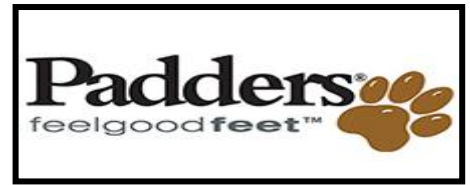


The 96th British Crown Green Bowling Association's Senior Individual Merit, sponsored by Padders feelgoodfeet, will go down as one of the most memorable of all time after an outstanding day's bowling. Known to many as 'The All England', Welsh wizard Mike Riley raided the excellent Meole Brace Bowling Club in Shrewsbury to beat North Lancs & Fylde's, Wayne 'The Beast' Ditchfield in a classic final, 21-19.

Everything about the day was superb. Meole Brace were excellent hosts providing superb organisation with plenty of hard working staff on hand to ensure the 1200 plus spectators were well watered and fed. BCGBA President, Barry Jennings, must be a proud man with his County and Club doing him proud.

The last eight onwards was filmed for Sky TV for a showing later in the year but those with internet access could watch live streaming via the 21up and talkingbowls websites. Bowls is often criticised as not being a television sport but the electric atmosphere during the later stages will certainly change this perception when the competitions hit our television screens. Thanks must go to the BCGBA for funding this and two other events (County Championship final and Champion of Champions) to promote our game and to Jimmy Parker, Mel Evans, Lynn Pritchatt and Martin Marks from the production company who worked tirelessly behind the scenes to make it happen.

Mike Riley was first of the finalists to take to the green at the 10'oclock start with an opening game with Yorkshire's Gordon Flower. Once the players had worked each others tactics out, Riley pulled away from 11-9 scoring three doubles in a four end burst and went on to a 21-12 victory. It was a similar story for Ditchfield in his opener with Greater Manchester Merit winner, Gareth Gwilliam. Gwilliam never saw the jack again from being 9-10 down as The Beast roared into round two to set up an eagerly anticipated clash with Shropshire favourite, Callum Wraight.



Callum knows how to play the crowd and he was on top form in creating plenty of noise and looking good for a place in the last 16 at 17-9 in front. Unfazed, Ditchfield went on another break as he did against Gwilliam, allowing Wraight just one more point in a 21-18 triumph. Whilst this was going on Riley was performing similar heroics on a subdued number one green against Kevin Boon (Potteries & District). Trailing 17-10, Riley was a relieved 21-20 winner.

Their last sixteen games could have gone either way only for a late flurry by bother players seeing them reach the televised last eight. Riley's six doubles against Steve Darling (Warwick & Worcester) proved vital in his 21-14 win while Ditchfield's seven against Tim Barnett (Derbyshire) including a six end of consecutive two's, four in favour of Ditchfield, saw him home 21-17.

The televised last eight moved to a packed number one green where Riley faced the fancied three-time Staffordshire Merit winner, Craig Barker. Riley was soon 10-3 up but four singles from Barker brought the players closer but once Riley retained the jack there was no stopping him as he stormed to a 21-7 victory. Ditchfield was up against Cumbrian Merit winner, Martin Gilpin. A similar start saw Ditchfield race to a 12-3 advantage but, using his vast experience, Gilpin drew level at 17 across. But his comeback was all in vain as Ditchfield finished with doubles at the next two ends.

Riley was in the first of the semi-finals to take to the green, facing Martin Lloyd of the host county, Shropshire, who just got the better of Mark Ferris (Potteries & District), 21-19 in his quarter-final. From 5-1 down, Riley went on a superb eight end break scoring 15 in the process with just a solitary single among his points. Lloyd fought back to 13-16 but couldn't push on to victory as Riley booked his place in the final, 21-15. Ditchfield meanwhile was involved in a cat and mouse encounter with North Midlands Paul Lamb. Neither player could get a decent run with the block but from 15 across it was Ditchfield who outscored his opponent to win 21-17.

The final was a great game with the lead changing hands constantly. Ditchfield drew first blood to go 4 nil up but Riley responded with a break of six without reply. Ditchfield regained the lead at 7-6 but then fell 10-7 behind. Back came Ditchfield to 12-10 with the players eventually drawing level at 12, 13, and 17 across. A single followed by a double left Riley in touching distance of the trophy but Ditchfield made him wait for victory with a double himself to bring the scores to 19-20. Riley capitalised on Ditchfield's poor lead and when The Beast failed to improve on his first wood it sent Welsh Wizard Mike Riley running round the green in sheer delight.

SEMI-FINALS NEXT IN SENIOR COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP



The final qualifying matches in the Endsleigh Senior County Championship went as many predicted with those in pole position at the start of the day's play reaching the semi-finals, to be played on Sunday 7th August.

The first semi-final will be between last season's runners-up, Greater Manchester, and Yorkshire with both sides finishing their sections with maximum points. Greater Manchester signed off with a rampant 118 chalk victory over North Lancs & Fylde, winning home and away, while Yorkshire were impressive in their 62 chalk defeat of Cheshire, also winning in both counties.

Potteries & District and Shropshire will contest the second semi-final after their final day victories secured their places in the last four. Potteries & District finished their section with two wins and a draw and their 35 chalk victory over Derbyshire put them one point clear of County Champions, Warwick & Worcester, who they beat in their crucial opening fixture.

Shropshire, the most recent winners (2009) of the four semi-finalists, were involved in a 'winner takes all' clash with Wales in the three-team Section Four. Both sides had beaten Cumbria so whoever won would progress. In an anticipated close match, Shropshire stormed into the semi-finals with an 84 chalk overall victory, winning at both venues.

With the exception of Section Four, sides finishing in second and third place qualify for the Supplementary County Championship, sponsored by Endsleigh. This year's competition will be played at Pennfields Bowls Club (WV3 7LZ) in Wolverhampton, venue of the BCGBA Merit in 2007, on the same day as the semi-finals. In Section Four, Isle of Man will replace third placed Cumbria.

The Supplementary County Championship is an eight-a-side competition consisting of two groups of four teams. The teams in each group play each other on a round robin basis with the group winners contesting the final. The groups are decided by a set formula, detailed in the BCGBA handbook (page 103).

Play gets underway at 10.00am and after a full day's play the winners will be presented with the Stan Higham Trophy, currently held by Wales.

MERWYN HOLTS RON IN VETERANS FINAL

With a combined age of 155 years, Merwyn Williams from Wales was a worthy winner of the BCGBA Veterans Individual Championship defeating BCGBA National Registrar, Ron Holt (Merseyside), 21-12 in the final.

Played at the excellent Prees Cricket & Recreation Club in Shropshire and sponsored once again by Grocontinental, the thirty-two strong field contained current holder, Tony Rawlinson (Lancashire), who also won in 2007, along with several bowlers with plenty of recent Senior County experience - Barry Booth (Potteries & District), Roger Crowther (Yorkshire), Alan Hill (Lancashire) and Roy Nicholson (Yorkshire).

Tony Rawlinson started well with a 21-12 first round victory over Mick Brown (Staffordshire) then 21-11 against Mick Hewitson (North Lancs & Fylde). But hopes of a third title were ended by Potteries & District's Barry Booth who was always in control in his 21-13 win.

Booth was immediately installed favourite after this win but he was always playing second fiddle to Merwyn Williams throughout their semi-final clinging on to a 21-18 victory after Booth had fought back from 19-12 to get within one point of his Welsh opponent.

Williams had quietly been going about his business seeing off Alan Hill (Lancashire) to 12, Ged Briddon (Derbyshire) to 11 before being involved in the game of the day with Roy Nicholson. Nicholson led 13-8 and 16-11 only to see his lead whittled away to a 19-16 deficit. Back came Nicholson to lead 20-19 only to succumb to two singles in an epic encounter.

Ron Holt's target for the day was to get through the first round; anything else would be a bonus. Well, he certainly earned his bonus with some battling performances as he defeated Barry Phillips (Wales) and Paul Hillam (Yorkshire) 21-14, he ran out on 'local' Barry Thomas from 15-18 and then booked his place in the final at the expense of Fred Donaldson (Potteries & District) 21-18 after they peeled at 18 across.

Williams took full advantage of a tiring Ron Holt reaching 17 before the BCGBA official could get on the score sheet. A three-end rally got him to double figures before Williams reclaimed the jack and went on to a 21-10 victory.

The presentation was made by the BCGBA President, Barry Jennings, and Mrs Rose Grocott from sponsors Grocontinental who confirmed their continued sponsorship of this popular event.



HOLDERS THROUGH TO JUNIOR SEMI-FINALS



As expected, there were no surprises in the final matches of the Drakes Pride Junior County Championship with Warwick & Worcester facing Greater Manchester with the current champions, Yorkshire, taking on Derbyshire in the semi-finals on Sunday 14th August.

Warwick & Worcester continued their impressive form in Section One with a 130 shot victory over Merseyside, claiming all winning cards in their home leg at Boldmere St Michaels though Merseyside can boast being the first side to defeat the midlanders away side in two years.

Greater Manchester defeated North Lancs & Fylde by 47 in their final match of Section Two where all sides had two points each at the start of play. Lancashire and North Midlands drew their match leaving North Lancs bottom of their section but with a plus average.

Yorkshire once again got the better of Wales with an impressive 87 shot victory in a re-run of last year's final and will take some stopping in their quest for back-to-back titles. Derbyshire are faced with the mammoth task of taming the strong Yorkshire outfit after overcoming Cumbria by 8 when the two unbeaten sides from Section Four met in their final match.

End after end both ladies played tremendous bowls to deny each other vital points with rarely a stray wood bowled. What a pity there were no television cameras to record this one as it would have been a great advert for crown green bowls and the ladies game in particular. The men have got something to live up to in their merit.

Maliza added her second title in three years with her 21-11 win to keep the C S Green (St Paul's Square) Trophy in her Warwickshire county after Kirsty Darling's win last year. For Nicola, it was runner-up for the second year running though she can take some comfort that the score line didn't reflect her performance.

Maliza was one of the first of the 64 ladies to take to the green when play got underway at 10am and started her day with a 21-14 victory over North Derbyshire's Darlene Walker quickly followed by a 21-11 defeat of former Junior Merit winner Cheryl Caswell from Shropshire. She then had a titanic battle with Maureen Lyons (Cheshire) just scraping through 21-20 after the pair had been locked at 20 across to reach the last 8.

Her quarter and semi-final games were of a similar pattern, running out to game from 14-13 against Alexis Lunn-Gadd (Yorkshire) and 12 across with Sarah Weaver from host county North Shropshire.

Nicola meanwhile had a tougher route to the final as after a comfortable 21-10 victory over Sheila Trail (South Derbyshire) she had to get through two 21-19 battles with Sally Evans (South Staffordshire) and Linda Williams (Wales). She came from 14-10 down to beat Marie Rhodes (Shropshire) 21-16 in the last 8 but was rarely troubled in her 21-11 semi-final victory over Emma Broad (Wales).

Two other former winners made it through to finals day - Maggie Barnes (2005) and Betty Phillips (2006). Unfortunately, both made first round exits to Sarah Weaver and Kerry Brown respectively.

Cheshire lost by 6 to Shropshire and with Mid Cheshire winning by 64 against Greater Manchester their superior aggregate saw them through to meet North Warwickshire, who like their neighbours, won all their matches.

In the Waterloo Cup, for the runners-up in each section, Cheshire play Coventry & District while North Derbyshire play Yorkshire in the semi-finals, also on 14th August.

TODMORDEN HOST VETERANS COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Both the British Crown Green men and British Crown Green ladies played their Veterans County Championship competitions on the excellent greens at Centre Vale Park, Todmorden.

Both events are for those players aged 60 and above, are played on a round-robin basis with 16 county teams split in for four groups with the group winners qualifying for the semi-finals and are 15up (although the men play to 21 with six on the card). Other similarities were that this year both events were played in glorious sunshine, new names were to be engraved on the trophy as neither finalists had won either event before and Yorkshire appeared in both finals.

THE LADIES were first to complete their competition and after the group stages were over holders Cheshire would play Yorkshire in one semi-final and the fancied Warwickshire would meet North Lancs & Fylde in the other semi.

Reputations went out of the window as Yorkshire left Cheshire shell-shocked by their 36 shot defeat in which the champions could only find one winner and Yorkshire's Freda Beaumont left her opponent on nil. North Lancs & Fylde were impressive as they defeated Warwickshire, in their splendid Osprey sponsored shirts, by 14. Both sides had four winners each but three single figure victories for North Lancs proved vital.

At the half way stage of the final, North Lancs & Fylde held a slender 4 shot lead despite claiming three winning cards. Yorkshire then got their noses in front for the first time thanks to a tremendous 15-5 victory for Linda Gledhill but their lead was short lived as North Lancs finished with three winning cards in which Gladys Gunby and Joan Jolly impressed with their respective 21-6 and 21-8 winning cards.

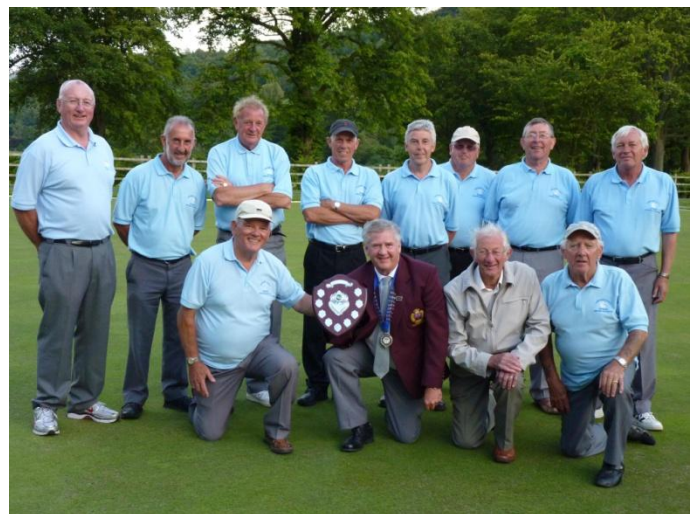
